



Tasks covered included: progress on the roof, plastering walls, a retaining wall in the front of the building, most of the landscaping, inside plumbing, and some

electrical work. Some of the upcoming tasks at hand are more electrical work, plumbing, flooring, ceiling, doors, windows, painting, and additional landscaping work.

Since they have returned home, the roof on the clinic has been completed! Praises to our Heavenly Father for His wonderful hand in this work. The Boumtjes plan to return again this summer to continue more work!

Approximately \$17,000 is still needed to reach the \$130,000 goal to finish building the clinic. Anyone wishing to




Collection Drive for The CALL

First Presbyterian Church of Magnolia, Arkansas The Minutes for the Stated Meeting of the Session Tuesday, January 28, 2024, 6:00 p.m.

The Session of the First Presbyterian Church of Magnolia, Arkansas, met for its monthly stated meeting on Tuesday, January 28, 2025.

The following members were present: Elder Jodie Arnold, Elder Travis Arnold, Elder and Clerk Dr. Paula Boaz, Elder Martine Boumtje, Elder Cathy Downs, Elder and Treasurer Kathy Gean, Elder Sue Joyce, Elder Chris White, and Pastor Ray Durham. Youth and Family Director Katherine Phillips was absent as she was attending a youth conference in Tennessee. Elder Ashley Hagaman had an excused absence due to illness.

Call to order: Pastor Ray Durham called the meeting to order, declared a quorum present, and opened the meeting with prayer at 6:00

The first order of business was for the Session to interview and question Yulissa Arnold, wife of Travis Arnold, on her request to become a member of First Presbyterian Church of Magnolia, Arkansas. Following the interview and questioning period, Elder Chris White moved to accept Yulissa into full membership of First Presbyterian Church. Elder Kathy Gean seconded, and Session voted unanimously to approve her membership.

Devotional: Elder Sue Joyce gave a devotional directed to our new Elders and governing body of Session members. She used passages from the EPC Book of Order and the Bible. Passages from the book of Proverbs which are guides for raising children and passages from Paul's letter to the Ephesians and verses from Acts for advice on being guided by the Holy Spirit.

- A letter request from EPC regarding annual reporting was addressed. Rev. Durham. Clerk Paula Boaz, and Church Secretary Brooke Wiliams will meet on Wednesday morning, February 5th to compile the report.

Committee Reports:

Administrative – Elder Chris White announced that a new nursery attendant has been hired for Sunday morning and Wednesday evenings. She will be an independent contractor, not staff.

Christian Education - Elder Jodie Arnold announced that letters will be going out to families and children to encourage Wednesday night activities. Sunday morning breakfast fellowship is steadily increasing in numbers. The breakfast was delicious!
