

#### First Presbyterian Church of Magnolia, Arkansas The Minutes for the Stated Meeting of the Session Tuesday, February 25, 2025, 6:00 p.m.

The Session of the First Presbyterian Church of Magnolia, Arkansas, met for its monthly Stated meeting on Tuesday, February 25, 2025.

The following members were present: Elder Jodie Arnold, Elder Travis Arnold, Elder and Clerk Dr. Paula Boaz, Elder Dr. Martine Boumtje, Elder Cathy Downs, Elder and Treasurer Kathy Gean, Elder Ashley Hagaman, Elder Chris White, Pastor Ray Durham, and Youth Director Katherine Phillips.

Call to order: Pastor Ray Durham called the meeting to order, declared a quorum present, and opened the meeting with prayer at 6:34 p.m.

Pastor Durham announced that the previous Sunday morning, February 23, the Bailey family met with Session members, requested membership, were appropriately questioned and voted into full church membership.

Devotional: Elder Martine Boumtje gave a devotional emphasizing that the Church is the Bride of Christ. Church members are "brides" and Christ takes care of us.

Youth and Family Ministries Director's Report: Director Katherine Phillips reported the Youth Conference she attended in Tennessee was excellent and provided good training sessions. Katherine is starting a new media campaign "Right Now Media". Youth are doing well, with 15 in Kids Club on Wednesdays and around 30 in the older group. She has plans for VBS with the theme "Joseph-From Prison to Palace".

Treasurer's Report: Elder and Treasurer Kathy Gean presented the financial reports for review. She informed Session that she had moved the Uhrich Pastoral account into the Sweep Account. Following review, the financials were accepted as information.

Approval of January Minutes: The January Minutes were reviewed. Elder Sue Joyce moved to approve, Elder Ashley Hagaman seconded, and Session voted unanimously.

Correspondence and Requests: none

Committee Reports:

Administrative - Elder Chris White brought up some issues about the new custodian services. Following discussion, Chris will speak to him to correct some deficiencies. There have been some issues with Wi-Fi and internet services. The Bensberg company made a \$7,000 proposal for upgrading and maintaining the system which the committee recommended. Greg Jetton has been on a monthly retainer which will be cancelled.

Christian Education - Elder Jodie Arnold reported that the new Sunday morning schedule is going well with attendance increasing weekly. The committee is looking for someone to do music with the Youth. Jodie reports that Women's Ministry, Ladies' Circle, Young Women's Bible Class, Sunday Adult classes, and Wednesday night group are all growing in attendance.

Fellowship – Elder Ashley Hagaman thanked Anita Moore for doing the bulk of the Committee work during the month. She stated that the food pantries need more food to be well stocked. The committee will probably have a church potluck to celebrate Brooke Bailey's school graduation.

Mission and Evangelism-The committee prepared and served their regular meal for the Southern Christian and planned the menus for the March shut-ins and first Wednesday church meal. The Committee will also be collecting for Undie Sunday in March and delivering cleaning supplies to The CALL families.

Worship-Elder Dr. Dan Dykema reported that the committee met and planned all things related to the Lenten season, including Ash Wednesday service and communion.

Young Adult Outreach – Elder Travis Arnold announced that his committee includes himself, his wife Yulissa, Grant Baker, and Matthew DeSeguirant. They have discussed organizing and coming events.

New Business:

- a. The Youth group will help pack clothing for Cameroon.
- b. Elder Martine Boumtje announced that the roof is on the new medical clinic in Cameroon.
- c. The EPC Gulf-South meeting will be in Meridian, Mississippi. Drs. Pierre Boumtje, Martine Boumtje, and Ray Durham plan to attend.
- d. There was general discussion on organizing a committee of volunteers to visit shut-in and nursing home members.

Old Business: none

There being no Further Business, Rev Durham closed the meeting with Prayer at 7:45 PM.


